
A Remarkable Fall

BRAVER ANGELS MODEL DEBUTED AT USD

In February, the dean of the Knudson School of Law at the University of South Dakota initiated a collaboration to introduce his law students to the style of debate we call "Courageous Conversations."

The chosen topic for debate was the age of marriageability in South Dakota, currently set at 18, but potentially adjustable to 16 with the consent of only one parent. Half of the class advocated for retaining the current legal arrangement, while the other half argued against the provision permitting 16-year-olds to marry with parental consent.

MEG Steps Up

VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVE LAUDED

The McGovern Engagement Group (MEG) chose to take on the task of getting as many DWU students registered to vote as possible.

Our club designed and printed posters to put up around campus. The McGovern Center chipped in a small gift certificate to the Tiger Café to all who registered for the first time. We registered 28 new voters.

South Dakota Secretary of State Monae Johnson learned about DWU's efforts and awarded the club with the first-ever Gladys Pyle Award.

One of the more remarkable events at DWU this year was our cooperative efforts in voter preparation. We were contacted by representatives of South Dakota Public Broadcasting (SDPB) this summer with an idea. They wanted to come to campus and live broadcast an informative two-hour special to assist South Dakotans with ballot information for the upcoming general election. We had an extraordinarily complicated ballot this year with seven complex constitutional amendments or initiated measures. SDPB invited representatives from both the affirmative and negative sides to all these issues and asked DWU to organize students to assist in question preparation and presentation. Joel Allen and Julie Brookbank, DWU's associate director of communciation, coached and helped students come up with a list of questions to ask the representatives regarding these ballot measures. Overall, the event was a success and was attended and streamed by many online.

COURAGEOUS CONVERSATIONS CONTINUE

We recently ventured into the potentially dangerous territory of initiating Courageous Conversations on the question: "Is America a Christian Nation?"

We hosted one event on the DWU campus and a second debate in Sioux Falls at Asbury United Methodist Church with the assistance of both pastors. The event on Mitchell's campus drew around 30 people, and the conversation in Sioux Falls had about 80. Both conversations were vigorous with many people participating. In spring 2025, our theme will be "Immigration and Deportation." We're planning three events at DWU and will also return to Sioux Falls for another conversation
